On many occasions, I tried to defend and sensitize my village mates about the importance of educating children but with every attempt, an annoying and spirit-crushing question was addressed to me, "What makes you different from us now, since we are doing the same things and far better off than you are?"

This made me wait eagerly and listen to all the presidential addresses on the radio. And every time I missed the address, I would hustle, buy data and google the updates. This went on for about a year and many months till the 30th of December 2021 when the President lifted the ban off schools as long as they followed S. O . Ps The news found me sitting with a relative listening to the address as my beautiful wife was preparing a light meal in the kitchen. I was overwhelmed by happiness making me jump and shout at the top of my voice. This made my wife run to my aid, storming into the house only to meet her happy husband jumping around with joy.

The next day I called Mr. Ocheng a fellow teacher at **Restoration High School** and shared the great news with him. We were all excited and couldn't wait to meet and resume teaching at our great school.

On reaching Restoration Assembly Church, I was warmly welcomed with news informing me about the new premises recently constructed for our school. I couldn't believe the news, so I rushed to the site. With teary eyes, I couldn't stop thanking God for such an achievement.

This new building has boosted our exposure as a high school in our local community, raising our numbers from 89 students to 100, not forgetting the fact that more students are enrolled with every day that goes by.

We are extremely grateful to God for the blessing, our Director Bishop Frank Butayi for allowing God to do great things through him, and the partners who supported him towards achieving this great milestone.
